LOZERE, THE ULTIMATE NATURAL DESTINATION

If you love nature and the great outdoors then Lozere is the place to be! It's hiking heaven: the Via Podiensis (Santiago de Compostela path), a section of which is listed as UNESCO Wor-Id Heritage, runs in and out of the region. It's also home to the Stevenson Trail whose myriad landscapes you can drink with a donkey if you so desire! Calling all cyclists: Lozere has just been named a "Territoire Vélo" (Cycling Region) by the French Cycling Tourism Federation. Mountain bikers can hit the GTMC (Grande Traversée du Massif Central). One of the sections has been approved by "Vélo et Fromage" meaning you can pair the joy of cycling and experiencing local traditions with sampling local cheese. www.en.lozere-tourisme.com/discover






LOZERE, AN AUTHENTIC AND TRADITIONAL DESTINATION

Lozere is a land of legends: one of them is the Beast of Gevaudan, a terrifying creature who killed a hundred people and was the talk of town in 1764. The wonderfully unspoilt area plays host to the Cevennes National Park (the only French national park with a residential centre) and Aubrac Regional Nature Park whose sprawling

plateaus dotted with lakes are reminiscent of the Highlands. Three of the "Most Beautiful Villages in France" (Sainte-Enimie, La Garde Guerin and La Malzieu-Ville) call Lozere home. Further south, the Causses & Cevennes area has UNESCO status for its agro-pastoralism and landscapes.


"WFH" ACCOMMODATION FOR REMOTE WORKING


IN AND AROUND MILLAU, HEAVEN FOR OUTDOOR SPORTS




FOOD. DRINK AND THE GOOD LIFE: THE BEST OF ARIEGE

IN THE CENTRAL PYRENEES (HAUTE-GARONNE)

THE GR®10: A LEGENDARY FOOTPATH THROUGH THE PYRENEES

Occitanie is hiking heaven and packed with footpaths where you can soak up untamed and unspoilt scenery. One of the most famous hiking trails is the GR®10, 850km across the Pyrenees from Banyuls-sur-mer in the east (Pyrénées-Orientales) to Hendaye in the west (Pyrénées-Atlantiques)! Bursting with peaks exceeding an altitude of 3000m and year-round snow, Southern Haute-Garonne treats hikers on this legendary trail to its most show-stopping views.

2000 YEARS OF HISTORY IN SAINT-BERTRAND-DE-COMMINGES

Listed as one of "the most beautiful villages in France," Saint-Bertrand-de-Comminges towers over the ancient city of Lugdunum Convenae founded almost 2000 years ago. Visitors will fall in love with its medieval lanes and Sainte-Marie Cathedral that looms like an impregnable fortress surrounded by greenery at the bottom of the majestic Pyrenees. The cathedral is a UNESCO landmark as part of the Ways of St James, as is Saint-Just de Valcabrere Basilica which you can spot in the valley.

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LUCHON, THE QUEEN OF THE PYRENEES

You can't help but be won over by the ageold charm of Luchon, a pretty spa town with classic Belle Epoque architectural heritage. The world's greats, from Napoléon III to the author Gustave Flaubert, spent time here in the 19th century and the town's fame earned it the nickname the "Queen of the Pyrenees". Luchon is the start point for fantastic hikes and MTB rides (17 signposted trails) in the land of marmots, streams and waterfalls. Finally, the Pech Merle Cave in Cabrerets one of the finest examples of cave art in France. An authentic cave with paintings dating back to 29 000 years

• THE SEASIDE ONE: Euro-Vélo8 or the Mediterranean Route (360km in Occitanie) along the Mediterranean coast from Italy to Spain
